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You are invited to attend the Clarkson Public School Open House on Monday, August 12th, beginning at 6:00 pm in the lobby.

Classes for grades K-12 will commence at **8:05 a.m.** on Wednesday, August 14th. High school students should report to the new gym at 8:10 a.m. for orientation. Elementary students report to the multipurpose room. The first day of school will be dismissed at 1:00 p.m. with buses running.

A normal school day will run from 8:05 a.m. to 3:37 p.m., this includes kindergarten.

Season Activity Passes

For the 2019-2020 school year, admission to athletic events will be adults \$5.00 and students \$4.00. We are offering fall sports, winter sports, or yearly sports passes. Each pass will be good for all home athletic games, excluding tournaments and NSAA playoff games.

Individual fall - \$25.00

Family fall - \$75.00 (two adults and an unlimited number of children-through high school)

Individual winter - \$25.00

Family winter - \$75.00 (two adults and an unlimited number of children-through high school)

Individual year - \$45.00

Family year – \$140.00 (two adults and an unlimited number of children-through high school)

These passes can be purchased at the high school office (892-3454) after August 16th.

Free Senior Citizen Activity Passes are available for sporting events for those who qualify (65 years of age or older). These passes may be picked up at the high school office during school hours. If you have a Senior Citizen pass from last year it will still be honored. There is no need to get a new one.

School Hours and Inclement Weather

The school day will begin at 8:05 a.m. and end at 3:37 p.m. If it is necessary to dismiss or cancel classes because of inclement weather, a JMC message will be sent via the phone number and the email address you furnish.



Bus Service

Buses will arrive at the school after 7:50 a.m. Parents are asked not to bring children before that time. Buses will leave school at 3:43 p.m. (5 minutes after classes are dismissed).

Drivers will contact parents concerning times prior to August 13th. Exact routes will be sent home with your child. Contact the driver, NOT the school office, for any needed clarification.

If you wish to have bus transportation and haven't previously had children riding the bus, or if your children will not be riding the bus this year, please notify school personnel as soon as possible (892-3454).

- 4. You will be able to access information on: attendance, report cards, progress, parent contact information you provided the school, and lunch account. The progress report will show the course registration.



Food Service

Breakfast will again be available at Clarkson Public Schools. Take advantage of this option to ensure your child eats a nutritious breakfast. Recent studies show a link between nutrition and learning. A nutritious breakfast helps students be more alert so they can actively participate in class. Breakfast has vitamins and nutrients for a strong and healthy body.

Breakfast at school is affordable, too. If you qualify for free and reduced price meals, you also qualify for the breakfast program, with no additional paperwork.

So take advantage of this opportunity to start the day on the right foot. Your child will find breakfast at school provides not only a nutritious meal but also a relaxed atmosphere for socializing with friends and siblings.

Serving time: 7:45-8:05 a.m.
Price: \$1.95 per meal,
\$.30 reduced*, free* (*if qualified)
No advance registration necessary! All students are
welcome every day!

Each day your student will be served milk, juice and will have their choice between cereal, a cereal bar, or the main offered that day.

School lunch prices will be \$2.75 for grades K-6, \$3.00 for grades 7-12, \$.40 reduced*, free* (if qualified). If you do not want your child(ren) to purchase extras, you need to discuss that with your child(ren) so they know. We will not be able to control if students get extras. We are looking forward to serving your children nutritious and exciting school lunches this year.

Lunches will be served the first day of school. Free and reduced price meals will be available to those who qualify. 2019-2020 application forms will be given out at the Open House or sent home with the oldest child in each family the first day of school. Complete the application and return it to the office by Friday, August 23rd. Students who received free or reduced meals at the end of last school year will continue to receive them until this year's application is approved, changed or denied or 30 days into the school year.

In your student's packet of information, your family should receive a Free and Reduced Price Meal Application. This application actually serves two purposes:

1) It helps the school to determine if your family qualifies for full-price, reduced-price or free

school meals. This includes full-price, reduced-price or free School Breakfast as well!!

2) The application is also used to determine how much state funding our school receives for supplies like books, classroom furniture, and other school resources. It is important that all families complete and return these applications to the school.

Clarkson Public Schools receives no district funds to operate the breakfast and lunch program. Our program is self-sufficient. Therefore the district is asking lunch account holders to keep their accounts up to date. Any student/family with charges of \$30.00 or more will not be able to charge for extras and will be on a cash only basis for the extras. Any student/family with charges of \$100.00 or more will receive a peanut butter and jelly sandwich, milk, vegetable and fruit for lunch. The student will be charged the regular price meal. Cereal will be given at breakfast and absolutely no extras will be charged. We feel this is a better approach than not allowing students to eat until charges are paid. School lunch and breakfast is a privilege and we try to keep meal prices affordable for everyone.

The lunch account system is NOT a retail (pay as you go system). It is intended to be a "drawdown" system. This is where you put a "bulk" amount in your account (be it once every two weeks or once a month). Please keep a positive amount in your account at all times. Monthly statements are simply to advise you on your status. They are not bills or invoices. Student lunches will be kept track of with the JMC Lunch Program. You can monitor your lunch account through your JMC account. Please inform your student if you will not allow them to purchase extras. It is too hard for our lunchroom staff to control this.

The kitchen staff would like to welcome everyone back to school. It is hard to believe the summer is past, and the school year is beginning.

Our goal again this year is to give the students a healthy and tasty meal. We will be trying new items and would like the student's opinions on them.

We encourage the student's parents and grandparents to join them for school lunches. If you would like to eat with the student please call the school office before 8:30 that morning. We wish everyone a great 2019 - 2020 school year!!


The members really enjoyed themselves. We were able to stay at the Hilton Palacio del Rio, which was on the Riverwalk. We

Figuring Out Science

Summer is quickly coming to a close and I am excited to start the new year working with students to figure out science. You might be asking, what does it mean to figure out science? It is exactly as it sounds. Students will be using science skills to figure out a phenomenon or problem that is in their everyday lives. There are several key shifts in learning that stem from the National Research Council (NRC) of the National Academy of Sciences and are the foundation for the new Nebraska College and Career Readiness Standards for Science. I have spent several days this summer attending workshops and trainings to better understand and implement these new shifts in learning. Luckily for parents, the state has published a more parent-friendly flier, explaining these key shifts. You can check out their explanation here: http://bit.ly/NEParentsGuide. As the school year progresses. I challenge you to have discussions with your children and ask them "What are you figuring out in science?"

Puzzled by All the Forms??

We are encouraging parents to fill out the Back to School paperwork online at the Open House (or ahead of time if you have your parent login information for JMC) - less papers you'll have to take home!!!

If you choose not to do the paperwork online your children will receive numerous forms on the first day of school. The following instructions will help you speedily process this important information.

- 1) Each family should receive a JMC Messaging form. Please return to the school by Friday, August 23rd.
- 2) The oldest child in each family should receive a Student Assurance Services insurance application form and cover letter with waiver form.

If you decide to insure your child through this insurance plan you need to:

- 1) complete the application form,
- 2) enclose a check made out to Student
- Assurance Services, Inc. and
- 3) return both to the school office by Friday, August 23rd.

If you do not intend to purchase Student Assurance Services insurance:

- 1) indicate on the waiver form (or the insurance application form) that you do not plan on purchasing this insurance,
 - 2) return the waiver form with your signature to the office by Friday, August 23rd.

It is acceptable to return only one waiver form per family provided all students in your family are listed on the form.

- 3) We will be placing the yearbook online and your oldest child will be bringing home the signature pages of the handbook after the first day of classes on Wednesday, August 14th. The signature sheets are due back into school by Friday, August 23rd.
- 4) If you have a child(ren) in grades 7-12, you will have to fill out the 1:1 Computer Usage Agreement and pay the laptop user fee. Please read with you child(ren) and fill out the paperwork. Return to the office by Friday, August 23rd.
- 5) The oldest child in each family should receive a Free/Reduced Lunch Application packet. If interested, please complete the application and return it to the office by Friday, August 23rd.

We will also have the forms available during the Open House so you can get them done before school starts. If you do not receive any of the above forms contact Amy. The deadline for returning all of the above forms is: Friday, August 23rd.

Student Absences

If you know in advance that your child(ren) will not be in school because of an appointment, funeral, or other upcoming event, send a note with your child several days before so he/she has a chance to get assignments from teachers. Please keep us informed! Call us by 8:20 a.m. if your child(ren) will be late or absent. We take attendance and lunch count first thing every morning. It is MANDATORY that the student brings a note to the office explaining the reason for the absence.

JMC Messaging

Clarkson Public Schools will be using the JMC Messaging Program to notify parents, students and staff of school information such as school cancellations, postponements, early dismissals, calendar changes and other pertinent school information. A database will be developed to get this information out to parents, students and staff. Parents will be able to fill out the information at the open house on August 12th. We would like you to provide us with the telephone numbers and email you would like to be used for notification. This program will call or text the number(s) you have listed with a message from the school. If you do not answer, a message will be left. The system will not be able to leave a message on your cell phone if you have to type in a mailbox number to get to your voicemail. You can list your email address, home number, cell phone number, and any other number(s) you want called or texted. The number that will show on your caller ID will be the school's number. If you have any questions regarding this please give the school a call.



Sexual Harassment Policy

It shall be the policy of the Clarkson Public School District to prohibit sexual harassment of employees, applicants for employment, and students on any work premises where the District has total control of the premises or can otherwise lawfully exert its jurisdiction. Telephone Guidelines

Parents and students, please keep in mind the following guidelines:

Students will not be called to the phone during the day unless a family emergency or crisis occurs. Messages can be left with someone in the office who will deliver it and post it on the students' locker.

Students are to get permission from the office to use the phone to make local calls. In an emergency, a student must get permission from the office to make a long distance call.

Annual Asbestos Notice

Current Federal Regulations require all schools to identify and manage asbestos containing materials (ACM) and develop a management plan to identify and control ACM in their buildings.

The presence of asbestos in a building does not mean that the health of the building occupants is necessarily endangered. As long as asbestoscontaining material (ACM) remains in good condition and is not disturbed, exposure is unlikely. When building maintenance, repair, renovation, or other activities disturb ACM, or if it is damaged, asbestos fibers are released creating a potential hazard to building occupants.

The plan is now available for inspection to the general public, or any school personnel at the office. For further information, contact Rich Lemburg, 892-3454. The school may charge for copies of the plan. The plan for the Clarkson Public School has also been submitted to the Nebraska Department of Health, Division of Environmental Health and Housing Surveillance, in accordance with current federal regulations.

Title I Welcomes You to a New School Year

Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools. The goal of Title I is a high-quality education for every child, so the program provides extra help to students who need it most. These are children who are the furthest from meeting the standards the state has set for all children.

The federal government provides funding to states each year for Title I. States send the money to

school districts based on the numbers of low-income families. The local school district identifies eligible schools and provides Title I resources.

Our school identifies students most in need of educational help (students do not have to be from low-income families to receive help). Goals are set for student improvement, we measure progress made each year, and welcome parent involvement.

To meet the student improvement goals Title I offer smaller classes, additional teachers and assistants, extra time for instruction, and a variety of teaching methods and materials. Title I teachers and classroom teachers work closely together.

Clarkson Public School receives Title I money. Clarkson Public School has employed certified teachers and paraeducators. They are highly qualified and meet the requirements of the federal No Child Left Behind and Nebraska's Rule 10 expectations. You may request information regarding the qualifications of your child's teacher and teachers. This information can be reviewed in our District's Administration Office. research and common sense tell us that quality teaching is the single most important factor in helping students learn and achieve, we are committed to recruiting and keeping caring, competent school staff.

Clarkson School District Seeks Children with Special Needs

The Clarkson School District is looking for unidentified children with special needs as it participates in "Nebraska Childfind." This is an ongoing statewide search for all unserved children with disabilities, birth through age 21.

Children who would benefit from special education services may not be receiving them because parents may not know of available programs or because they do not recognize the handicapping condition of their children.

Special programs are available through public schools for children with disabilities, which may pose restrictions on learning. These areas may include: speech/language; hearing/vision; learning disabilities; mentally handicapped; behavioral disorders; physical, severe, or multiple handicaps. Nebraska law guarantees a free appropriate public education to children.

Parents who feel their children should be receiving special education services are asked to contact Superintendent Rich Lemburg, at the Clarkson Public School, 892-3454. Nebraska Childfind provides information also through their toll free number 800-742-7594.


