Class registration seems so long ago, but it is time for parents and students to revisit their plans for this academic year. We will not mail out schedules. Instead, parents and students will be able to access their schedule on JMC through the internet before school starts. If you do not have reliable internet access at home, give me a call and we can help you! Please utilize the school's website:

- 1. Select the link JMC Gradebook
- 2. Click on the Parents icon.

- 3. Enter your username and password (this information has been sent home in the past and has not changed)
 Please call the school if you need assistance.
- 4. You will be able to access information on: attendance, report cards, progress, parent contact information you provided the school, and lunch account. The progress report will show the courses your student is registered for.

Breakfast and Lunch News

Clarkson Public Schools receives no district funds to operate the breakfast and lunch program. Our program is self-sufficient. Therefore the district is asking lunch account holders to keep their accounts up to date. Due the increased charging of meals and extras, a different limit has been set on the amount of money a student/family will be allowed to charge before action is taken. Any student/family with charges of \$30.00 or more will not be able to charge for extras and will be on a cash only basis for the extras. Any student/family with charges of \$100.00 or more will receive a peanut butter and jelly sandwich, milk, vegetable and fruit for lunch. The student will be charged the regular price meal. Cereal will be given at breakfast and absolutely no extras will be charged. We feel this is a better approach than not allowing students to eat until charges are paid. School lunch and breakfast is a privilege and we try to keep meal prices affordable for everyone.

Please make sure to fill out the Free and Reduced meal application that will be sent home on the first day of school as your family may qualify for free or reduced meal prices.

Bus Service

Student Absences

If you know in advance that your child(ren) will not be in school because of an appointment, funeral, or other upcoming event, send a note with your child several days before so he/she has a chance to get assignments from teachers.

Please keep us informed! Call us by 8:30 a.m. if your child(ren) will be late or absent. We take attendance and lunch count first thing every morning. It is MANDATORY that the student bring a note explaining the reason for the absence.



Season Activity Passes

For the 2014-2015 school year, admission to athletic events will be adults \$5.00 and students \$3.00. We are offering fall sports, winter sports, or yearly sports passes. Each pass will be good for all home athletic games, excluding tournaments and NSAA playoff games.

Individual fall - \$25.00
Family fall
(two adults and an unlimited number of children-through high school) \$75.00

Individual winter - \$25.00 Family winter (two adults and an unlimited number of children-through high school) \$75.00

Individual year - \$45.00 Family year – (two adults and an unlimited number of children-through high school) \$140.00

These passes can be purchased at the high school office (892-3454) after August 14.

Free Senior Citizen Activity Passes are available for sporting events for those who qualify (65 years of age or older). These passes may be picked up at the high school office during school hours.

*If you have a Senior Citizen pass from last year it will still be honored. There is no need to get a new one.





Food Service

Breakfast At School

Mornings can be really crazy! The alarm doesn't go off, the kids don't want to get up, there's no time to eat breakfast before the bus comes or they're just not ready to eat. Or maybe your teenager grabs a can of soda and a candy bar on the way to school. If this sounds like your house, we have good news for you.

Breakfast will again be available at Clarkson Public Schools. Take advantage of this option to ensure your child eats a nutritious breakfast. Recent studies show a link between nutrition and learning. A nutritious breakfast helps students be more alert so they can actively participate in class. Breakfast has vitamins and nutrients for a strong and healthy body.

Breakfast at school is affordable, too. If you qualify for free and reduced price meals, you also qualify for the breakfast program, with no additional paperwork.

So take advantage of this opportunity to start the day on the right foot. Your child will find breakfast at school provides not only a nutritious meal but also a relaxed atmosphere for socializing with friends and siblings.

Serving time: 7:45-8:05 a.m.
Price: \$1.75 per meal,
\$.30 reduced*, free* (*if qualified)
No advance registration necessary! All students
are welcome every day!

Each day your student will be served milk, juice and will have their choice between cereal, a cereal bar, or the main offered that day.

School lunch prices will be \$2.40 for grades K-6, \$2.65 for grades 7-12. If you do not want your child(ren) to purchase extras, you need to discuss that with your child(ren) so they know. We will not be able to control if students get extras. We are looking forward to serving your children nutritious and exciting school lunches this year.

Lunches will be served the first day of school. Free and reduced price meals will be

available to those who qualify. 2014-2015 application forms will be given to the oldest child in each family the first day of school. Complete the application and return it to the office by Friday, August 22nd. Students who received free or reduced meals at the end of last school year will continue to receive them until this year's application is approved, changed or denied or 30 days into the school year.

In your student's packet of information, your family should receive a Free and Reduced Price Meal Application. This application actually serves two purposes:

- 1) It helps the school to determine if your family qualifies for full-price, reduced-price or free school meals. This includes full-price, reduced-price or free School Breakfast as well!!
- 2) The application is also used to determine how much state funding our school receives for supplies like books, classroom furniture, and other school resources. It is important that all families complete and return these applications to the school.

The lunch account system is NOT a retail (pay as you go system). It is intended to be a "drawdown" system. This is where you put a "bulk" amount in your account (be it once every two weeks or once a month). Please keep a positive amount in your account at all times. Monthly statements are simply to advise you on your status. They are not bills or invoices. Student lunches will be kept track of with the JMC Lunch Program. You can monitor your lunch account through your JMC account. Please inform your student if you will not allow them to purchase extras. It is too hard for our lunchroom staff to control this.

Telephone Guidelines

Parents and students, please keep in mind the following guidelines:

Students will not be called to the phone during the day unless a family emergency or crisis occurs. Messages can be left with someone in the office who will deliver it and post it on the students' locker.

Students are to get permission to use the phone to make local calls. Calls must be limited to three minutes. In an emergency a student must get permission from the office to make a long distance call.



Puzzled by All the Forms??

Your children will receive numerous forms on the first day of school. The following instructions will help you speedily process this important information.

Each K-12 student should receive a Student Assurance Services insurance application form and cover letter with waiver form. If you decide to insure your child through this insurance plan you need to:

- 1) complete the application form,
- 2) enclose a check made out to Student Assurance Services, Inc. and
- 3) return both to the school office by Friday, August 22nd. If you do not intend to purchase Student Assurance Services insurance:
- 1) indicate on the waiver form (or the insurance application form) that you do not plan on purchasing this insurance,
- 2) return the waiver form with your signature to the office by Friday, August 22nd.

It is acceptable to return only one waiver form per family provided all students in your family are listed on the form.

We will have one student handbook for students K-12 this school year. Each student will receive a handbook. At the back of each handbook are forms which require signatures. Your signature indicates that you have read and understand the guidelines established by Clarkson Public School. Please sign in the indicated places and return the forms to your child's teacher or the high school office by Friday, August 22nd. Please note the additional medical information sheets and the Computer Usage Agreement (grades 7-12) in the handbook.

The oldest child in each family should receive a Free/Reduced Lunch Application packet. If interested, please complete the application and return it to the office by Friday, August 22nd.

If you did not receive any of the above forms contact Amy. The deadline for returning all of the above forms is: Friday, August 22nd

Immunization Requirements for 2014-2015 School Year

A second dose of varicella (chickenpox) or documentation of varicella disease <u>will be</u> <u>required from all students</u>, <u>K-12</u>, under the rules and regulations (Title 173, chapter 3). Although not a legal requirement until the 2011-2012, 2 doses of varicella have been the routine immunization recommendation since 2006 by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American Academy of Family Physicians. Previous rules and regulations (2004) have required all students to have at least one varicella immunization or documentation of disease on file.

Documentation of varicella disease can be signed by healthcare providers or parents/guardians. If a student has had varicella disease, no varicella immunizations are needed.

Exemptions that apply to school immunization requirements:

* Medical waiver from an MD, DO, nurse practitioner or physician's

assistant documenting the reason for the identified vaccine;

* Notarized religious affidavit.

Because the immunization rules and regulations have a provisional immunization clause, no child will be prevented from beginning the school year. The provisional enrollment status allows children who have received at least one of each of the required immunizations to attend school as long as they are moving as quickly as medically-feasible to complete the series.

Reminder: Entering 7th graders also need documentation of a dose of Tdap (tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis).

The regulatory authority for this requirement is found in Title 173 Nebraska Administrative Code Chapter 3, as revised 7/13/10, sections 3-008.01B and 3-008.01C (page 4). Find the full text of the regulations:

Reminder for all kindergarten and 7th grade students to have their immunizations completed before the start of school. The following are the required immunizations for these students:

3 doses DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td vaccine
3 doses Polio vaccine
2 doses MMR vaccine
3 doses Hepatitis B vaccine
2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine
or written documentation of chickenpox
from parent or health care provider

Clarkson School District Seeks Children with Special Needs

The Clarkson School District is looking for unidentified children with special needs as it participates in "Nebraska Childfind." This is an ongoing statewide search for all unserved children with disabilities, birth through age 21.

Children who would benefit from special education services may not be receiving them because parents may not know of available programs or because they do not recognize the handicapping condition of their children.

Special programs are available through public schools for children with disabilities which may pose restrictions on learning. These areas may include: speech/language; hearing/vision; learning disabilities; mentally handicapped; behavioral disorders; physical, severe, or multiple handicaps. Nebraska law guarantees a free appropriate public education to children.

Parents who feel their children should be receiving special education services are asked to contact Administrator Rich Lemburg, at the Clarkson Public School, 892-3454. Nebraska Childfind provides information also through their toll free number 800-742-7594.

Annual Asbestos Notice

Current Federal Regulations require all schools to identify and manage asbestos containing materials (ACM) and develop a management plan to identify and control ACM in their buildings.

The presence of asbestos in a building does not mean that the health of the building occupants is necessarily endangered. As long as asbestos containing material (ACM) remains in good condition and is not disturbed, exposure is unlikely. When building maintenance, repair, renovation, or other activities disturb ACM, or if it is damaged, asbestos fibers are released creating a potential hazard to building occupants.

The plan is now available for inspection to the general public, or any school personnel at the office. For further information, contact Rich Lemburg, 892-3454. The school may charge for copies of the plan. The plan for the Clarkson Public School has also been submitted to the Nebraska Department of Health, Division of Environmental Health and Housing Surveillance, in accordance with current federal regulations.

The school day will begin at 8:10 a.m. and end at 3:36 p.m. If it is necessary to dismiss or cancel classes because of inclement weather, an AlertNow message will be sent via the phone number and the email address you furnish.

Clarkson Public Schools will again be using the program AlertNow. This program will be used to notify parents, students and staff of school information such as school cancellations. postponements, early dismissals, calendar changes and other pertinent school information. A database will be developed to get this information out to parents, students and staff. Parents will be receiving a paper to fill out at the beginning of the school year. We would like you to provide us with the telephone numbers and email you would like to be used for notification. This program will call the number(s) you have listed with a message from the school. If you do not answer, a message will be left. The system will not be able to leave a message on your cell phone if you have to type in a mailbox number to get to your voicemail. You can list your home number, cell phone number, and any other number(s) you want called. The number that will show on your caller ID will be the school's number. If you have any questions regarding this please give the school a call.
