# Tommy McEvoy Signs to play Football at University of Wyoming.

On Wednesday, December 17th, Tommy McEvoy signed his letter of intent to play football in Laramie at the University of Wyoming. Tommy had a roller coaster career for the Clarkson-Leigh Patriots. Suffering three season ending injuries in 4 years. He dislocated his elbow during his breakout freshmen season missing the final 2 games. Just prior to the start of his junior year he tore his right ACL in a basketball open gym, and his senior year he tore his left ACL during the 1st quarter of the second game of the season. Sandwiched in between Tommy had an All-State sophomore season. His film was good enough to garner a lot of attention from Colleges ranging from the University of Nebraska to Wayne State. Despite not playing as a junior Tommy received several Division II offers and had a Scholarship offer from Division I (FCS) South Dakota. Several other Division I schools were waiting for his senior film before making any offers. Once Tommy tore his second ACL in the Elmwood-Murdock game, the Division I dream seemed in jeopardy. Coach Aaron Bohl, LB coach for Wyoming, stayed in contact with Tommy and liked enough of what he saw in the Cross County game to still recruit him. Coach Bohl was not able to offer a scholarship because of the lack of film, but believed that Tommy is a Division I player so he offered Tommy a Preferred Walk-on (PWO) spot. Tommy was the only PWO that Wyoming offered this cycle confirming their belief that they think Tommy will develop and become a valuable player for the Cowboys.

Tommy is very grateful for the opportunity that Coach Bohl has given to play at the highest level. Tommy is a great representation of the Clarkson-Leigh football program, and will be the same for the Cowboys. The coaches and players are sad that we did not see more of Tommy on the field or court in high school but know that he will make the most of his opportunity at the next level. Tommy is the son of assistant football coach and Clarkson's Social Studies Teacher Bob McEvoy and Heather McEvoy. He has 2 sisters, former Patriot, Sarah McEvoy and current sophomore Samantha McEvoy.
