In the past few years, we have seen an increase in the number of students who need emotional and psychological help with the day-to-day pressures of being a teenager and everything that is going on in their lives. This problem has really been amplified by the Pandemic. Our society has been dealing with the past couple of years. When dealing with this situation in the past, one of two things have played out, either the student leaves school to get help or the student struggles to get help as their parents can't either afford the help or can't take off work to get their children in to appointments.

With the help of the State of Nebraska putting a big emphasis on this problem, along with funding from ESSERS, the ESU's and larger school districts are adding Licensed Mental Health Practitioners (LMHP) to their staffs. With these additions we have been able to get services to students inside the building and during the school day. Everything is confidentially done with the parent's approval. If this help is something you would be interested in for your child, please reach out to Mrs. Kappel and we can help and support your child.


Zach Gall (by Alessa Gall)
