Math News

As we move into April it is getting hard to keep the students' attention. Spring is in the air! The spring activities have started. We regularly have lots of students gone, and it is a lot of work on Mondays to get the students thinking about math again. With all the distractions we are still moving forward and will continue to work hard as we finish the year.

In Algebra I we will be working with polynomial operations. Geometry just finished working with triangle similarity and will start working with right triangles and trigonometry. Algebra II will be moving from exponential and logarithmic functions to rational functions. Pre-Calculus will be working with trigonometric functions.





A second group of 7th graders is working on a unit called nuevos amigos en la escuela (new friends at school). They can use different hellos & goodbyes, tell how they're doing, recognize hispanic names & nationalities (and locate Spanish-speaking countries on a map), and tell their names & introduce others. They're off to a great start!

In Spanish 1, they are in the middle of a unit on Tourism in Costa Rica. Besides being able to give basic info about the country and being able to throw out a few slang terms they might hear in Costa Rica, the students have explored ecological activities, foods to eat, how coffee is made, and they will soon be investigating different places to stay and will begin the process of planning, budgeting for and promoting their own trips to Costa Rica. I can imagine that some of their trips will look really enticing!

Spanish 2 is finishing up una semana en Barcelona (a week in Barcelona). They have explored basic info about the city of Barcelona as well as fun places to visit there. They checked out different museums, types of transportation and must-try foods/drinks. They made an itinerary for themselves and calculated the cost of a week in Barcelona and even talked about ways to make their trip cheaper to stay within their assigned budgets. This unit integrated a lot of basic life skills into our Spanish lessons; those are really important too!

Spanish 3/4 is just starting into a new unit. They are trying a new format! Since this time of year gets really hectic with a myriad of activities (and so often, the students in the Spanish 3/4 group seem to be involved in every activity), we're experimenting with more of a hybrid classroom where all of their lessons and tasks are available on Canvas (our online learning platform) to accommodate student absences, but we'll have small-group lessons with those who are here on areas they need extra practice on. We hope that by making tweaks to improve this new format, we will be able to continue to use it during the 4th quarter in future years to reduce end—of-the-year activity chaos!

6th Grade History Happenings



The 6th graders have been doing a great job of actively participating in world history! They worked in teams to be able to "escape" the classroom by solving the clues to complete an Escape Room about Hammurabi's Code. Even though everyone didn't get done, I let them go to 2nd period! To understand the Nile River Basin a little better, they created 3D models and labeled important areas. They used soil, clay, paint, and sand to make their model a reflection of the area.

Mummification was an area of interest for the class so we brought in an expert! We zoomed with Julia Jones, a

mortuary student, so she could explain the process of embalming and mummification as the Egyptians did it. We learned about why they did what they did. The students cringed at the thought of removing brains through the nose! They also learned about Egyptian canopic jars that held the organs of the pharaohs and kings. They tried their own different mixtures of salt and baking soda to preserve a slice of an apple. They were surprised by the difference it made in the color of the apple and how it reacted. To wrap up the unit they had a choice of projects. We had slideshow presentations of pharaohs, their own mummy at home, and pyramids made of Legos and even one made of bouillon cubes!
