Dear Parents,

The start of the 2022-2023 school year has been great and now it's time for us to register boys and girls, grades 3-6, for the youth basketball season. Once your child is registered you'll be receiving information on practices from the coaches. Practices will not start until November. Teams will practice on Saturday mornings and once during the week. 3rd graders will only practice on Saturday mornings.

Boys and girls who are interested in participating in the youth basketball program this year should fill out the form on the bottom portion of this sheet and send the sheet and their registration back to school to their respective offices. There is a registration fee of \$15/player to help with costs, this fee covers both volleyball and basketball. If you have paid this fee for the volleyball season already, you do not need to pay the fee again. An additional fee of \$15 is needed for 3rd graders or new students/players as they come into the Little Pats program. The \$15 pays for the basketball jerseys the players will use for games. They will continue to use these jerseys throughout their time in the youth program.

Coaches will be communicating with their teams in regards to leagues, tournaments and games.

Coaches/parents will decide what events/tournaments they attend. The cost of tournaments are paid by the Patriot Youth Council. 3rd Grade will practice this winter to start the year. They will play at halftime of some Clarkson-Leigh home games. Our main goal with this grade level and every grade level is to promote fundamentals and fun at this age

As you build your winter calendar we want you to know that our Patriot Youth Basketball Tournament has been scheduled for Saturday, February 11th. Once again, our primary focus is to create a positive culture that enforces fundamentals and fun.
