After the bond passed in November, I promised to keep everyone updated on the building project for Clarkson Public Schools. As we start off 2025, I wanted to give the first update of many to everyone on the Clarkson Public Schools building project.

The next step in the process will be CWP, our architects, having additional pre-design meetings with staff members to finalize identifying wants and needs for the building, playground, etc. During this time, we will also have a couple of studies done on soil, existing structures, power, etc. to aid in analyzing for the schematic design phase of the project. Once we get into February, CWP will start to move into the design development phase of the project and they will work with BD, our builders, on building and structural plans for building.

Construction will be done in phases starting with the new elementary school beside the old gym and followed soon by the new entrance on the east side of the building. The last phase will be the construction of the CTE wing and some remodeling to the initial 1952 building. CTW and BD will be up for our March, 2025 Board Meeting to update the Board and the Bond Committee on the process.

I will end on my annual parent reminder for this time of year, please remember that January and February are very hectic months as we head into the back part of the winter sports/activity season. Between Youth, Jr. Hi, C Team, JV and Varsity contests and then throw in Speech meets and Ag Contests the months of January and February really keep everyone hopping. This doesn't include the joy of dealing with the weather and dealing with postponements and rescheduling of activities. Please make sure you are communicating with your kids and make sure they are keeping up with their work.

On To College ACT Test Preparation

This fall several juniors participated in the On To College John Baylor ACT Test Prep program. All juniors in the state of Nebraska will complete the ACT in March which serves as Nebraska's state assessment.

Why should you care about the ACT assessment?

1. The ACT is a predictor of college and career readiness. The ACT National Career Readiness Certification is used to measure each student's foundational work skills important for job success across industries and occupations. Visit www.act.org/NCRC-indicator to learn more.
2. Provide information about student learning and direction for future instruction. Identifying collective areas of strengths and weaknesses can help direct future improvement goals.
3. Evaluating school and district achievement in comparison to state and national averages.
4. ACT scores are used to gain entrance into specific college courses such as math and English for early entry courses during high school and upon college enrollment. Scores are sometimes a requirement for entry into particular college programs of study.
5. Specific colleges may use scores to determine merit-based scholarships such as Board of Governors, Board of Regents, or other types of scholarships.

Fifteen students initially expressed an interest in attending the On To College test prep sessions, offered during lunch and Patriot Period. We began meeting in October and concluded the second week of December. Twelve students completed the sessions with eight taking a full-length practice test.

The junior class in its entirety will again participate in the On To College test prep sessions in the spring during their core course instruction, leading up to the March 25th test date.
