Preschool Did you

Our program aligns daily activities and routines with The Creative Curriculum for Preschool. The Creative Curriculum is based on 38 objectives for development and learning. All of the objectives are fully aligned with the state and national early learning standards. Our curriculum enables children to develop confidence, creativity, and lifelong critical thinking skills. The curriculum is also aligned with Teaching Strategies GOLD. Teaching Strategies GOLD is the assessment system used in our preschool classrooms. Our morning and afternoon programs are geared to meet the needs of the children that are attending and do not accomplish the same tasks. The Morning program is specifically for our younger students introducing them to a structured environment while our afternoon program is geared to get our students ready for kindergarten.

Math News

As we move into April it is getting hard to keep the students' attention. Spring is in the air! The spring activities have started. We regularly have lots of students gone, and it is a lot of work on Mondays to get the students thinking about math again. With all the distractions we are still moving forward and will continue to work hard as we finish the year.

In Algebra I we will be working with polynomial operations. Geometry just finished working with triangle similarity and will start working with right triangles and trigonometry. Algebra II will be moving from exponential and logarithmic functions to rational functions.

Third Grade

State testing time is coming up, and I want to share some helpful information as the third graders get ready for their very first NSCAS test! I want them to feel confident and do their best without any stress.

The NSCAS (Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System) is a state-required test that all third graders take to measure their learning in key subjects like reading and math. The test is designed to assess what students have learned so far and help teachers understand where they might need extra support.

Unlike regular classroom tests, NSCAS doesn't affect report card grades. Instead, it helps our school and teachers adjust instruction to better support student learning. I encourage students to think of it as a way to show what they know rather than something to stress about.

To make reviewing fun and engaging, we will be having Easter egg hunts as a way to reinforce key concepts before the test in April! Students will search for eggs containing review questions and work together to solve them, turning test prep into an exciting and interactive experience.

I have no doubt in my mind that they will all succeed, and I am so proud of their hard work!
